From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

As we enter a new period of our work together under the Designated Term Pastor Covenant, I want to express my gratitude to all who have worked so energetically to move the Church of the Palms to a stronger place. Along with the Pastoral Search Committee, the New Beginnings Assessment process will help us not only get a better sense of where the Church is at present but also uncover a robust vision and direction for the future. To guide my work with you, the Leadership Council and I have agreed to the following goals for the coming six month period of the Covenant:

- 1. Continue to strengthen new governance model & increase participation from the membership by working with Leadership Council & Ministry Teams; and, to plan & offering a workshop in early 2019 on decision-making by consensus as recommended at time new constitution was adopted.
- 2. Continue to provide opportunities for conversation about the church's future, and spiritual growth
- 3. Work with the Spiritual Life Team to a) review membership status of current members, b) follow up with inactive members, and c) assist with training greeters and ushers
- 4. Work with Administration Team & Leadership Council to address need for year-round Stewardship Program
- 5. Work with Leadership Council & Ministry Teams to consider options for addressing what it means to be *Open and Affirming* with the congregation
- Recruit, train & empower Communications Coordinator(s) (volunteer) to manage website, Facebook page, & weekly email.

These are goals that will continue to build on the foundations we have laid over the past two years. I hope you will join the leadership of the Congregation and myself in moving the Church of the Palms into the future God has in store for us.

MISSION TEAM

- Discussed project idea of providing mailbox services for the homeless through a UPS outlet.
- Agreed that inviting various members of the faith communities and permissible governmental agencies to speak with our Congregation about where we can do the most good with the least overlap with other congregations and agencies.
- Discussed holding a Book Fair in conjunction with Faith Formation Team and resuming the Racial Amity series

One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice. This year, special consideration will be given to projects focusing on serving our immigrant neighbors and communities.

CROS Ministries

CROS' IMPACT in 2017 Programs to Eliminate Hunger:

- Seven Community Food Pantries distributed food to 66,570 individuals, 35% of whom were children.
- The Caring Kitchen served 68,841 meals. Cason UMC distributed 15,360 brown bag weekend lunches.
- CROS Gleaning recovered 497,142 pounds of fresh produce which was distributed to local food programs by the Palm Beach County Food Bank (2016)


